About Bedford Borough

Bedford Borough is in the East of England, around 60 miles north of London.

There is a population of over 174,000 people in the Borough. About two-thirds of them live in the towns of Bedford and Kempston, and the remaining third in the villages.

We are a proudly diverse Borough, with 149 different languages spoken in our schools.



How will I get money?

Setting up a bank account

The currency is the UK in the Pound Sterling (£). £1 (one pound) = 100p (pennies, or pence). Cash is generally accepted but increasingly people use debit/credit cards to pay for goods and services.

You will need to set up a UK bank account as a priority on arriving here. You can do this in person, in a bank or online.

Accessing Benefits

Your "Leave to Remain" to stay into the UK has been extended to give you access to the benefits system:

Universal Credit

A payment for those of working age, to help with your living costs if you're on a low income. You could be working (including self-employed or part time) or be out of work; <u>Apply for Universal Credit</u>.

Pension Credit

Extra money to help with your living costs if you are over the age of 66 and on a low income. Applications for Pensions is <u>online</u>.

Disability benefits

Extra money to help with additional costs if you have a long term physical or mental health condition or disability.

Carer's Allowance

Extra money if you care for someone at least 35 hours a week.

Child Benefit

Extra money to help with the cost of raising a child.

To access any of these you will need to apply for a National Insurance Number, which you can apply for online. When you make an application, you will need to give a copy of your passport and proof that you have the right to work.

Immediate Financial Help

People arriving in the UK through the Homes for Ukraine visa route are entitled to an immediate payment of £200 per person. This will be paid to you by Bedford Borough Council. You or your host should let us know when you arrive in the UK and we will explain how you can claim the payment. We can also help with a weekly payment until you start to receive benefits or are working, and may be able to help with exceptional costs.

Employment

If you need help to look for a job, Bedford Borough Council has a support service called the Jobs Hub which can be accessed for free.

This service is based in the town centre and you can book an appointment by calling 01234 223510 or by dropping in.

The advisors can help you to write a CV, help with job searching and applying for jobs. The advisors can also help you to find out how to get to work using local transport and print out maps for you.

You can use computers and the internet for free at The Jobs Hub too. The Jobs Hub is based at 15 Greyfriars, Bedford, MK40 1JH.



Schools and Nurseries

How do I get a school place for my child?

In Bedford Borough, we mainly have a two tier system of education: primary and secondary schools.

Children can go to primary or lower school in the school year after they become 4 years of age (if born between 01/09/2016 and 31/08/2017 for September 2022).


Most children will move at 11+ years to a secondary school. Some children will move at 9+ years to a local middle school and then at 13+ years to a local upper school, but this will all be explained when your child is accepted into a school.

Applying for a school place (In Year Transfers)

If your child was born between 31/08/2006 and 01/09/2016 you will need to complete an In Year Transfer Admission Form to apply for a school place for your child, you can find out more on out website. Please don't worry if you do not know which year group the child will be in, you can just select the year group that you think is correct and we will work out this out for you. Once we have received your application, it will be processed within 15 school days.

How can I get a place for my child who is aged between 2 and 4 years old?

In Bedford Borough we have a wide range of different Early Years settings that are available for you to send your child to. We have nurseries, pre-schools and childminders, which all offer high quality care and education. Our settings all follow the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum which will ensure your child gets the best possible start to their education. Free School Meals

Your child may be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM). Once a school place has been offered, please speak to your child's new school regarding FSM eligibility and what information you will need to have when applying.

In an Emergency

The UK emergency services can be contacted 24 hours a day in an emergency situation. The Police, Fire & Ambulance can all be contacted by calling 999.

Police

If a serious offence is in progress or someone is in immediate danger - call 999. To contact the Police for a non-emergency situation, please call 101.

Ambulance

If someone's lift is at risk - call 999.

Fire & Rescue

If there is a fire - call 999.

Healthcare

The National Health Service (NHS) provides health services to people living in the UK. Most of these services are free.

Family doctors are called GPs, and outside an emergency this is usually the first doctor you will see to access healthcare. To receive medical treatment, please register with a GP as soon as possible, even if you are not ill. You can find you local GP on the NHS website.

Protecting Children and Vulnerable Adults

If you're worried that a child or young person is at risk of neglect, harm or abuse, it's important that you tell someone.

If you think the child is in immediate danger, call the police on 999.

If the child's not in immediate danger, but you're still concerned about them, please contact the Council 0300 300 8123 (out of hours), or report it via our <u>website</u>.

If you are concerned about an adult, for example if you think they are vulnerable or the victim of abuse please call the Council at 0300 300 8123, or report it via our <u>website</u>.

Libraries

Libraries are free to visit, free to join and free to borrow books, and there are free activities for children of all ages.

There are computers and internet free to use for one hour every day at Bedford Borough libraries, and WiFi is free all day for people on their own devices. All you need to do is be a member of the library. It is free and you can sign up at any of our libraries:
