Council bid for funding for Ampthill Road

Bedford Borough Council is hoping to ease congestion on Bedford's busy Ampthill Road by bidding for £5.1 million of funding that would be used to improve the road.

The Council submitted an application to the South East Midland Local Enterprise Partnership (SEMLEP) to be included in their bid for government funding for transport improvements.

Improvement measures proposed include enhanced signals and junctions which can respond better to heavy traffic; information systems that report on current traffic conditions; improved capacity for vehicles at key junctions along the route; as well as improved access and traffic management at the Interchange Retail Park.

Following the successful application a bid will be made to the government by SEMLEP in autumn 2016 for a share of an allocated £1.8 billion in government funding.

Successful projects will be notified in early 2017.

Blue Badge fraud uncovered

Teresa Sacco of Grafton Road, Bedford, pleaded guilty to two counts of fraud for using a blue badge that did not belong to her after an allegation of misuse was referred to council services.

In a hearing at Bedford Magistrates Court on 27 July, Mrs Sacco pleaded guilty and was issued with a twelve month Conditional Discharge and ordered to pay a total of £115 by way of court costs and a victim surcharge.

Is the electoral register information for your property correct?

This month all households in Bedford Borough will receive a letter asking them to confirm the names of those eligible to vote who are living at the property. The process is quick and simple if you go online to www.bedford.gov.uk/household-update.

You need to be included in the electoral register in order to vote. Even if you are registered for council tax or council services you still need to apply to register as an elector. Credit reference agencies use the electoral register as part of their services to banks and loan companies. Not being included in the electoral register may also harm your access to credit.

Bedford Parks awarded Green Flag status

Four parks in Bedford Borough have been judged to be among the best in the country after receiving a prestigious Green Flag Award – the mark of a quality park or green space.

Priory Country Park, Harrold Odell Country Park, Addison Howard Park and Bedford Park will all be flying their new Green Flags on site this summer.

The Green Flag Awards are judged by more than 700 green space experts, who visit applicant sites and assess them against eight strict criteria, including horticultural standards, cleanliness, sustainability and community involvement.

A Green Flag flying overhead is a sign to the public that the space boasts the highest possible standards, is beautifully maintained and has excellent facilities.

Priory Country Park has the longest history of being awarded the Green Flag, having won it for fifteen years running, while Harrold-Odell Country Park has been awarded a green flag for nine years! Winning these Green Flag Awards is testament to the continued high standards and hard work that has gone into maintaining and improving the grounds at these local parks.

In addition, last week both Harrold-Odell Country Park and Priory Country Park were awarded Certificates of Excellence by travel website Trip Advisor. The TripAdvisor Certificate of Excellence is awarded to attractions that consistently achieve outstanding traveller reviews on TripAdvisor.

Bedford Borough Libraries are nearly a month into this year's Summer Reading Challenge, with 2,650 children having joined the challenge already - but there is still time to sign up at your local library!

After reading six books children will collect a certificate; if they read twelve library books they will be rewarded with a pair of amazing rainbow glasses; and by reading a mammoth eighteen library books children will receive a medal!

The Challenge has a new theme each year and for 2016, it's The Big Friendly Read, delivered in collaboration with The Roald Dahl Literary Estate to celebrate what would be have been his 100th birthday!

Picasso and the Masters of Print

Opens 15 October at The Higgins Bedford

Picasso and the Masters of Print will be opening at The Higgins Bedford on 15 October, offering a unique opportunity to view some of the most important prints by one of the most highly regarded artists of the 20th century.

Renowned for his paintings and sculptures, Picasso was also the twentieth century's greatest printmaker and the seven prints by Picasso held at The Higgins Bedford will showcase the varied printmaking techniques that he mastered.

The print 'Still Life under the Lamp', 1962 is a highlight of the exhibition and one of Picasso's best known linocuts. Although by then well into his 80s, Picasso continued to innovate, using a complex new technique to create this colourful night-time scene.

'The Frugal Meal', 1904, is the earliest work in the exhibition and

one of the last works of Picasso's Blue Period. A haunting depiction of an emaciated couple in a café in Montmarte, The Frugal Meal is considered to be one of the masterpieces of twentieth century graphic art.

These stunning works will be accompanied by a wider exhibition of major artists' original prints drawn from the Cecil Higgins Collection and further afield. Five centuries of printmaking will be on show, ranging from masterpieces by key figures in the history of European printmaking, such as Rembrandt, Picasso and Matisse.

The Exhibition will continue until April 16 2017 and a programme of gallery tours, talks and workshops will be announced in the coming months. Entry is free of charge.
