Conditions of Licence – Building Materials on the Public Highway (Highways Act 1980, Section 171)

The following conditions must be observed in respect to all building materials on the public highway:

A site meeting must be held prior to the storage of materials, detailing the conditions of the highway together with appropriate photographs. Please call 01234 718040 to arrange a suitable date and time for a site meeting.

Materials may only be stored in the place agreed at the site meeting with Council staff.

Materials must be stored in a safe manner. Pipes and loose materials must be held in place by appropriate means.

Materials must not be positioned so as to obstruct other highway users, i.e. not across any access to premises or obstructing pedestrian traffic in any way.

Materials are not to be positioned over gullies, fire hydrants, inspection covers etc

Materials on the verge must be stored more than 300mm from the kerb edge.

The highway surrounding the place where the materials are to be stored must be kept in a clean and tidy condition during the period of the licence.

Any damage to the highway caused by the materials, or from any action by the applicant shall be remedied at the applicant's cost.
