

Notice of Confirmation of an Order

BEDFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL (WILDEN: PART OF FOOTPATH No. A10) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2021

On 04 March 2024 the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirmed the above Order with modifications made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the Order as confirmed will divert that length of Public Footpath number A10 Wilden commencing from a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Footpath number A10 Wilden to be retained at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) TL 0958/5471 shown as Point A on the attached map then running in a generally southerly direction for 146 metres to a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Footpath number A10 to be retained at OSGR TL 0956/5456 shown as Point B on the attached map to a route commencing from a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Footpath number A10 Wilden to be retained at OSGR TL 0958/5471 shown as Point A on the attached map to a route commencing from a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Footpath number A10 Wilden to be retained at OSGR TL 0958/5471 shown as Point A on the attached map then running in a generally westerly, south westerly, south-easterly and easterly direction for 255 metres to a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Footpath number A10 Wilden to be retained OSGR TL 0956/5456 shown as Point B on the attached map then number A10 Wilden to be retained OSGR TL 0956/5456 shown as Point B on the attached map.

The Order comes into force on 01 April 2024, but if any person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within six weeks from 06 June 2024 make an application to the High Court.
