ALL TRAFFIC NO. 71) MODIFICATION ORDER 2020**

On 31 October 2023, the Secretary of State confirmed with modifications the abovementioned order made under section 53(2)(b) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The effect of the order as confirmed is to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:

Modifying the definitive map and statement for the area by adding to them a Restricted Byway commencing from a point where it has a junction with that part of Dag Lane which is shown on the List of Streets as a highway maintainable at the public expense at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) TL 0364/6288 shown as Point A on the Order Map then running in a generally north-westerly direction for approximately 116 metres to a point at OSGR TL 0356/6296 then running in a generally north-easterly direction for approximately 280 metres to a point at OSGR TL 0368/6321 shown as Point B on the Order Map.

A copy of the Order and the Order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at Borough Hall, Cauldwell Street, Bedford by appointment from 10am to 4pm on Weekdays (Bank and Public Holidays excepted). The order comes into force on the day that it is confirmed but if any person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity on the ground that that it is not within the powers of Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, or on the ground that any requirement of Schedule 15 of the Act has, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may under paragraph 12 (1) of Schedule 15 to the Act within six weeks from 14 December 2023, make an application to the High Court.
