It starts at Green End. Gap by field gate, the F.P. approx. 2 ft. wide exists appearing to belong to garden of private house and it is doubtful if this is used at all by the general public. There is an old stile at the back boundary fence but this has been obstructed (by an old bed rail). From this point there is only very slight evidence that a F.P. has existed. It follows hedge on its west side until F.P. joins F.P. A.8 and then turns westerly with hedge now on south side. The F.P. continues becoming very marshy in places until it connects with Gipsy Lane.


