About this qualification

This professional development qualification provides essential knowledge and skills to anyone wanting to actively support individuals with learning disabilities. The Award is suitable for people who come into contact with individuals with learning disabilities as part of their job.

Progression is built in to the Level 2 or 3 Diploma in Health and Social Care (Adults) for England qualifications. Learners can also progress to the Level 3 Award and Certificate in Supporting Individuals with Learning Disabilities, as they contain some shared units. If learners have completed any of the shared units, credits can be carried over without the need to repeat learning.

Entry requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification but learners should be at least 16 years of age.

Experience in the workplace

Learners will need to be working, volunteering or on practical placement as they will need to show competence in both knowledge and skills.

Qualification structure

Level 2 Award in Supporting Individuals with Learning Disabilities To gain the Award learners must achieve a minimum of 12 credits.

4 credits must be achieved from the mandatory unit. The remaining **8 credits** have to be achieved from the choice of optional units.
