

# NCFE CACHE Level 2 Award in Support Work in Schools

Qualification facts



## About this qualification

This qualification provides an introduction to the information and knowledge needed to work in a variety of full and part-time support roles in schools. This includes administrative roles, site support roles, technical roles and volunteers, as well as those roles that work directly with children and young people.

It is appropriate for learners not yet employed in a school, as well as providing initial training and induction for those new in post and includes one optional unit that allows learners to achieve above the level of qualification.

### Entry requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification but learners will need to be at least 16 years of age.

## Experience in the workplace

As it is a knowledge based qualification, it is appropriate for learners not yet employed in a school.

### Qualification structure

To gain the qualification learners will need to achieve 12 credits with 9 credits coming from the mandatory units.

They will then need to achieve a minimum of **3 credits** from the group of optional units.

The four mandatory units also form part of the Level 2 Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools and the Level 2 Certificate in Supporting the Wider Curriculum in Schools. This enables credits and learning to be transferred from this qualification to the other Level 2 Certificates - providing direct progression routes.

The qualification will be pass or refer and all the assessment criteria of the chosen units must be achieved in order to obtain a pass.
