**BEDFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL (BEDFORD (FORMER EXCLUDED AREA):
PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY ON FOOT BETWEEN MAITLAND STREET AND
COSTIN STREET) PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER 2020**

The above Order made on 29 July 2020 under Section 118 of the Highways Act 1980 will extinguish a Public Footpath in the former excluded area of Bedford Town commencing from a point where it has a junction with the eastern margin of publicly maintained road, Maitland Street, Bedford, between numbers 21 and 25 Maitland Street at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) TL 0464/4965 shown as Point A on the attached map then running in a generally east north-easterly direction for approximately 33 metres to the point where it has a junction with the western margin of publicly maintained road, Costin Street, Bedford, between numbers 20 and 24, Costin Street, Bedford at OSGR TL 0467/4967 shown as Point B on the order map.

A copy of the Order and the Order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge displayed at the main entrance to Borough Hall, Cauldwell Street, Bedford. Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn Bedford Borough Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.
