About us

Huddleston Way is a supported living project located in Bedford for adults with a learning disability. The project offers the opportunity to experience and progress into more independent living, through a tenancy with Stonewater Housing Association.

Services we offer

Huddleston Way is staffed from 7:00am – 11:00pm. Between the hours of 11:00pm and 7:00am there is a member of staff sleeping in that can be contacted in emergencies. The project is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week

We can provide the following training and support services:

- Shopping
- · Cooking and healthy eating
- Checking post and completing forms
- Using public transport Independent travel training

Our Aims

The main objectives of the project is to work with you to develop personal and independent living skills. We carry out assessments to identify the areas in which you may require training. This is used to enable a training plan for you to use at project to support your journey to independence.

We aim to achieve this by pursuing the following objectives:

- Working in partnership with you to create an environment that encourages personal development, confidence, self esteem and promotes your independence
- Respecting your individuality and preferences
- Acknowledging your rights to full involvement in decisions affecting your life
- Promoting rights to privacy, respect, individual choice and an understanding of responsibilities
- Encouraging you to express your views and concerns, listening to and then responding, both as groups and as individuals
- Respecting your cultural, ethnic and sexual identity and promoting choice
- Encouraging the use of independent advocates

We can also provide:

- Help and advice when you are moving into a new house or flat
- Independent living experience in a group home
- · Support with day-to-day living
- Support you to attend appointments such as the doctor, dentist or optician

Safeguarding adults
