# Falls prevention a national and local priority

- For individual distress, pain, injury, loss of confidence, loss of independence and death.
- For system significant use of health and social care resource
- The risk of falling increases with age, 1/3 over 65, 1/2 over 80 fall at least once a year, 10% hospital admissions
- 32,000 pop 65+, 10yr growth 24%
- A fall is the result of the interplay of multiple risk factors >400
- Require multidisciplinary assessment and intervention
- NICE clinical guideline and quality standard, Prevention
- Falls and fractures in older people are often **preventable**

# **Risk Factors for Falls**

#### Medical

- Polypharmacy
- Postural hypotension
- Medical condition e.g. PD
- Poor Hydration
- Anaemia

### **Physical**

- Reduced balance
- Walking problems
- Reduced muscle strength arms/legs
- Poor vision
- Poor hearing

Loss of sensation in the feet Public Health Agency


### **Psychological**

- Reduced motivation/depression
- Memory problems/confusion e.g dementia

#### **Environmental**

- Unsafe walking aids
- Inappropriate footwear
- Home hazards lighting, dogs, loose mats, grandchildren, wires, hosepipes
- Transfers bath, stairs bed, chair


## Hip fractures in people aged 65 and over
