

Notice of Confirmation of An Order

Highways Act 1980

**BEDFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL (RAVENSDEEN: PARTS OF FOOTPATH Nos. 8 AND 9)
PUBLIC PATH EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER 2020**

On 16 January 2024 the Secretary of State confirmed the above Order made under Section 118 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish;

- (i) That part of Public Footpath number 8 Ravensden that commences from a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Bridleway number 42 Ravensden to be extinguished by the, *"Bedford Borough Council (Ravensden: Part of Bridleway No. 42 and Parts of Footpath Nos. 8 and 11) Public Path Diversion Order 2020"* approximately 300 metres north of "Great Wood" at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) TL 0665/5598 shown as Point A on the order map then running a generally west-north-westerly direction for 109 metres to a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Footpath number 9 Ravensden to be extinguished by this order approximately 340 metres north of "Great Wood" at OSGR TL 0655/5603 shown as Point B on the order map.
- (ii) That part of Public Footpath number 9 Ravensden that commences from a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Footpath number 8 Ravensden to be extinguished by this order approximately 340 metres north of "Great Wood" at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) TL 0665/5603 shown as Point B on the order map then running a generally south-south-westerly direction for 361 metres to a point where it has a junction with that part of Public Footpath number 9 Ravensden to be retained adjacent to the north-western corner of "Great Wood" at OSGR TL 0647/5568 shown as Point C on the order map.

The Order comes into force on 30 January 2024, but if any person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within six weeks from 18 April 2024 make an application to the High Court.
